++MESSAGE FROM THE COORDINATOR

HI, Everyone,

I will try to keep this note a short one because we have an unusually long list of prayer intentions this time.

I suggest to you our focus today should be on the great Communion of Saints and how it can assist us in our efforts on behalf of our prodigal Catholics who we love so much. **Take full advantage of the Communion of Saints.**

Turn to the church militant, and ask grandparents, godparents, and friends to pray for your intentions. Contact local prayer groups, convents and monasteries and ask them to pray. Online you can use a search engine to find such web sites (entering Benedictine Monastery, Franciscan convent, etc will bring up many such web sites around the world. Most of these will take your prayer request.) Visit the MMMG web site

This being All Souls Day, it is a good day to **turn to the Church Suffering**. My mother often told me to pray for the poor souls and ask for their prayers in return. She'd say, "They can't pray for themselves anymore, but they can pray for you." So why not pray for the poor souls and ask them to pray for your intentions? Tradition says that praying "Jesus and Mary, I love you. Save Souls" will release souls from purgatory. Especially pray for your deceased relatives and friends. If your prodigal has grandparents, siblings, relatives and friends who have died, pray for them and ask for their prayers

Turn to the Church Triumphant and ask the saints in Heaven to intercede in your situation. St. Monica's perseverance in prayer for St. Augustine makes her an obvious choice for parents of prodigals. St. Odelia, is the patron of those who cannot see—some with their eyes and some with their hearts. St. Anthony is the finder of the lost. But, as we know, there are many more saints. Your prodigal's patron saint, *your* patron saint, St. Joseph, St. Ann, and so many others.

This morning a woman from Louisiana called to report that since she began praying with the MMG her son called to say he has requested the paperwork to begin seeking an annulment. She sends her thanks to all of you who have joined her in prayer. She asks continued prayer and says she will continue to pray for your intentions also. That's the Church Militant at work, people!

Before I close, I ask for your prayers for my family that we will continue to trust God and His Word and remain strong in the midst of the tempest that blows around us. We thank God that He is in control and that our trials, which may loom large to us, are only minor ones in the great scheme of things. God is good--all the time--God is good!

As we pray together, may we each continue to have the perseverance of St. Monica and the unconditional love of the father of the prodigal son until that glorious day when we, too, can say, "Rejoice with me! The prodigal for whom I have prayed has come home!" Peace,
