You have heard us say often that around here we try to wrap everything in prayer. We did the same thing when the job loss happened. Prayer sustained us through the long months, and prayer helps us express our joy.

Also, I have been praying about whether or not I was to continue volunteering with the MMG or return to technical writing in the corporate world. I believe that question has been answered now.

As we look back over the year, Bob and I count the many blessings we have received both personal and with the MMG. Bob sees the biggest personal blessing as being the time he has been able to spend with family—especially our little grandson. One Little Advent Story

One of our members recently shared this story with me. I think you may find it inspirational (I would love to hear your story, too):

On Christmas Eve in Franklin Park, Illinois in the early 1960s, it was a tradition that after supper, my parents and brothers and sister would all pile in the car. Dad would drive around so we could look at the Christmas lights on neighborhood houses. We always looked forward to a street that was, during the Christmas season, dubbed Candy Cane Lane. Every home on that street was decorated in lights, Christmas figures, and, of course, huge candy canes. It was like our dreams of Santa's home at the North Pole. When we returned home we would find that, in our absence, Santa Claus had come and put gifts under the Christmas tree. We never noticed that after we got in the car, my father would announce that he had to go back to the house because he had forgotten something-maybe his wallet, his gloves, or his pipe. With a family the size I grew up in someone was always forgetting something, so it never seemed unusual for Dad to do so once in awhile. It wasn't until I was older that I realized he had been busy being a helper to Santa's cause. When I thought about that part of my childhood, I thought about my own kids' growing-up years and especially about my son who is no longer going to mass on Sunday. Most of us will be praying for a prodigal Catholic at Christmas mass this year. It may appear as if nothing is happening, nothing is changing. We may even begin thinking that our prayer is useless, that it is hopeless. Well, I must remember that, just like my father on all those Christmas Eves, God, our Heavenly Father is working—quietly, unseen--arranging circumstances

so that one day His prodigal children will each search for the light of truth, and will find the gift of Faith waiting for them. As for we who pray for their return—I'm not sure what our part is—perhaps our prayers are the fuel for whatever the vehicle is that helps our prodigals make that journey. I've been paying attention to what has been being shared in these updates since I have joined the Marian Mantle Group and it has helped to change the way I look at my son's situation. This year, when I start to get concerned about my son at Christmas, I'm not going to let worry rob my joy. I'm going to pray and regain my peace of mind by believing that God is behind the scenes, working in the lives of our prodigals, arranging gifts for all of us. ~Please sign me: Father of a prodigal son

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GOD'S WORD FOR US

Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance" Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped. And the ransomed of the LORD shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away. ~lsaiah 35:3-5,10
